# IMPORTANT PRACTICAL INFORMATION

During the conference registration, everybody will get a name tag and public transit tickets. You will need both for the entire duration of the conference. Do not lose it. You will need your name tag for getting the meals and the public transit tickets to move around Warsaw.

All the lectures will take place in the Warsaw University Library (Dobra 56/66 st). You can take a bus nr 118 there from Place Konstytucji or take a subway to Centrum Nauki Kopernik and walk for 5 minutes. Alternatively, you can walk down to the Library from the Warsaw University Campus (Krakowskie Przedmieście 30 st).

Google Maps has a pretty good service for finding connections on the Warsaw public transit. Use this or alternatively you can also download Jakdojade - a local map that does exactly the same.

Jakdojade's interface is in both Polish and English.

The starting point for all the trips is Plac Konstytucji. We meet in front of the Millennium Bank. Remember to take your public transit tickets with you, water, and something to cover your head with. Please be on time.

On Sunday and Monday we meet for lunch in the Syrena squat (Wilcza 30 st) at 12.00. On Tuesday and Wednesday we will have lunches in different (suburban) venues selected by the person(s) leading the respective trips. On Saturday and Wednesday we will have welcoming and farewell parties at Syrena - we will also have dinners there. On Sunday, Monday and Tuesday we will have dinners at the Warsaw University Library right after the lectures end.

The two hostels that most conference participants stay at, the meeting point for the trips and Syrena are all very close to one another - it's a 5 minutes walk or even less.

We have only vegan catering and it will be provided by the Cafe Kryzys - a grassroots initiative of the Warsaw Tenants' Association and Syrena. Many people who have suffered an eviction have extensive work experience in the restaurant sector and we will eat food prepared and served by them.

You will have to sign up for a trip in order to attend it. Conference participants will be able to sign up for the trips of their choice during the evening lectures on Saturday (for the Sunday trips only) and on Sunday (for the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday trips). If you cannot sign up for the trips personally, ask a friend to do this for you. Unfortunately, we cannot sign people up electronically (e.g. by e-mail). There is an upper limit of 15 attendees per trip. There are no specific requirements - we accept people on a first-come-first-served basis.

It will be quite hot (in the range of 25-35 degrees Celsius) and we will spend a substantial part of the conference outdoors. Take sun screens with you. Tap water in Warsaw is drinkable and its quality is pretty good. We advise you to take a water bottle with you to Warsaw and refill it here whenever you will need to. This will be cheaper than buying water from stores and we (as the conference) won't add another heap to the mountain of plastic already polluting the planet.
